have been going to Santa Rosa hospitals a little more frequently these days. In Kaiser's hallways, there are these huge signs with instructions about stopping throughout the day and taking three deep breaths. I assume the signs are more for the staff and the visitors than the patients because of where the signs are located and because they give the patients this little plastic contraption and instruct them to breathe into it.

Religion has been giving us this wisdom forever! Why do you think that the word for Spirit – Spirit that calls, gathers, unites, strengthens, consoles, and on and on – is a breath word? The breath that turns clay into blushing humanity. The breath that Christ Jesus gave up on the cross so that we could have eternal life.

I have said this before (hey, I'm getting old and am allowed to repeat myself now):

There's a popular saying out there that goes, "It's not the number of breaths you take that define your life; it's the moments that take your breath away." And I disagree. I feel that what defines your life is the breaths you take AFTER those breath-taking moments (highs and lows). Your get up and go on.




TLC's Generosity


