A true story from my sister, Janet.

n Sunday, Dec. 21, Janet went out to lunch with one of the other Practioners at the Center for Spiritual Awareness in West Sacramento. They went to a Denny's restaurant. Over lunch, they got into a conversation about spiritual things they had read. The conversation led to them talking about what happens to you when something another person says to you hits you wrong. Janet had been reading a book by a Buddhist that offered the wisdom that when this happens, the other person pushes a button, but that you need to be aware that the button was already there; the other person didn't put the button there.




November Finance Update


nce again we had a deficit month in November. The deficit was \$1,702.56 with expenses of \$12,014.81 and income of only \$10,312.25. Our year to date deficit as of the end of November is \$13,447.99 far better than the budget projection for the year but still a substantial amount. Our total expenses for that time period were \$133,564.58 with income of only \$120, 116.59. The average monthly deficit is \$1,222.54 or \$305.65 per week. It appears extremely likely that December will also have a deficit. Cash reserves are dwindling. Many thanks to all who keep their pledges current and special thanks to those who give that additional amount. Your gifts are what keep us serving the Lord here at the corner of Fulton and College in Santa Rosa, California, USA, the world.

We are Givers

Despite our deficits our people continue to give. Gifts to others through December 14 are as follows: 2nd Mile projects \$675, ELCA malaria eradication \$95, ELCA Disaster Relief \$25, ELCA Hunger \$15, FISH (local food bank) \$779, Reconciling Works \$20, ELCA Good Gifts \$640, the Rwanda School Project \$1,019.65 and \$20 of Christmas offerings had been given for Lutheran Social Services of Northern California. More will be given for the latter. In addition \$786 was the total Thanksgiving holiday offering which goes to pay down the principal on our mortgage loan and \$2,078 has come in to help pay the mortgage in deficit months. Every little bit helps to keep us afloat and to help others. Thank you for being such generous people.
